AFFIDAVIT

1. I/we Knoxville History Project hereby solemnly swear or affirm that each statement in this application is true and correct and understand that if any statement contained herein is false, the permit issued is automatically forfeited and voided. Furthermore, that in the event of forfeiture I/we shall not be eligible to receive another permit for a period of ten (10) years pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated §57-5-105(d).
2. I/we understand that all applicants are charged with the responsibility of knowing the local and state beer laws. I/we are aware that the penalty for violating state or local beer laws can include revocation or suspension of the permit and/or the imposition of civil penalties up to ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED 00/100 DOLLARS (\$1,500.00) PER OFFENSE.
3. I/we understand that if the business allows illegal gambling on the premises that the beer permit will be subject to revocation.
4. I/we understand that a requirement of beer permit issuance is the permittee(s) and ON-SITE manager(s) who will supervise and/or sell and serve the beer at the event must complete alcohol education and training programs in accordance with City of Knoxville Code Section 4-60(c).
5. I/we understand that by submitting this application, a background investigation shall be conducted on the Event Manager. It is further understood that any and all documents related to that investigation shall become public record open for public inspection and reproduction pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 10-7-503.
6. I/we hereby release, absolve and hold harmless, the City of Knoxville, the Knoxville Beer Board, the Knoxville Police Department, and the employees, agents and representatives of all of the foregoing from any and all liability of whatever type for any damages, causes of actions, personal property injuries which may result as a consequence of my application for a beer permit, background investigation, release of documents or any other matters related to my application. I/we hereby waive all possible liability of the City of Knoxville, Knoxville Beer Board, Knoxville Police Department, and the employees, agents and representatives of all the foregoing as stated above.
7. I/we agree that the use of any server who has been convicted within the past ten (10) years of any law relating to the sale, possession, manufacture or transportation of intoxicating beverages, including beer, as defined by City of Knoxville Code Section 4-37 or the use of any server who has been convicted of any felony or crime involving moral turpitude within the past ten (10) years will be cause for possible revocation of the beer permit.
8. I/we understand if any information given in the application subsequently changes, I/we will immediately notify the Knoxville Beer Board c/o Business Tax Office.
9. I/we assume full responsibility for the permit and will be accountable for full compliance with the laws of Knoxville and the State of Tennessee in the sale of beer.
10. I/we have read the foregoing release. I/we fully understand its provisions, and voluntarily consent to abide by its requirements.
11. I/we acknowledge and understand that the fees paid for the beer permit application process are non-refundable.
12. The undersigned is the applicant or the bona fide and qualified agent/representative of the corporate applicant.

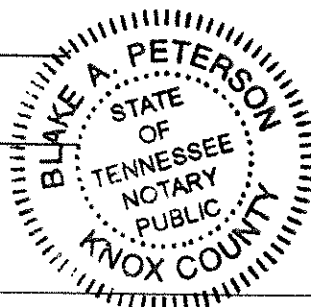

Plan for Server Compliance

This will be a private, ticketed event, taking place in a cordoned outdoor area with a street closure permitted by City of Knoxville Engineering, and supervised by Knoxville Police Department and City of Knoxville Emergency Medical Services.

All beer served at the event will be provided by Pretentious Beer Company, proprietor Matthew Cummings, who will be on site for the duration of the service.

Beverage service will consist of 1 "greeter" cocktail per guest, then wine and beer pairings with each of five (5) courses, and no other alcohol will be offered. All persons providing alcohol service will be professional servers holding current Server Permit, and will be supervised by Event Manager Nicole Stahl, Administrative Coordinator, Knoxville History Project, and Emily Crutcher, General Manager of Old City Wine Bar and Certified Sommelier.

The event will be fully enclosed using City-provided barricades at street intersections, and roped stanchions along the sidewalk sides. This is a seated dinner event, and pre-purchased tickets will be required for entry. IDs will be checked at entry, and wristbands issued for over-21 guests.
